2. Purpose of Publication Manual

This Publication Manual is useful for the public to:

1. Check the nature of the records which may already be available at Seychelles Fisheries Authority, without the need for submitting a formal ATIA request;
2. Have an understanding of how to make a request for access to a record of the Seychelles Fisheries Authority;
3. Access all the relevant contact details of the persons who will assist the public with the records they intend to access;
4. Know all the remedies available from the Seychelles Fisheries Authority regarding request for access to the records, before approaching the information commission;
5. The description of the services available to members of the public from the Seychelles Fisheries Authority, and how to gain access to those services;
6. A description of the guide on how to use ATIA, as updated by the information commission and how to obtain access to it;
7. If the body will process personal information, the purpose of processing of personal information and the description of the categories of data subject and of the information or categories of information relating thereto;
8. Know if the Seychelles Fisheries Authority has planned to transfer personal information outside the Republic of Seychelles and the recipients or categories of recipients to whom the personal information may be supplied; and
9. Know whether the Seychelles Fisheries Authority has appropriate security measures to ensure the confidentiality, integrity and availability of the personal information, which is to be processed.

3. Establishment of the Seychelles Fisheries Authority

The Seychelles Fisheries Authority (SFA) was established under the *Seychelles Fisheries Authority Act, 2024*. An act to provide for an authority to oversee the efficient management and sustainable development of the fisheries sector on a par with international norms, standards, and best practices and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

The Authority works closely with the Ministry of Fisheries, Agriculture and the Blue Economy and is governed by a Board of Directors, which is responsible for its policy, control, and management oversight. A Chief Executive Officer (CEO) has supervision over and directs the day-to-day affairs of the Authority.

3.1. Objectives / Mandate

The Seychelles Fisheries Authority Act, 2024 introduced several key changes to strengthen and modernise the institutional framework governing the Authority. Notably, it formalised the change of name from the Seychelles Fishing Authority to the Seychelles Fisheries Authority, better reflecting the expanded scope of its mandate and functions.

The Authority was originally established in August 1984 under the Seychelles Fishing Authority (Establishment) Act as the executive arm of the Government of Seychelles in the field of fisheries, with the mandate to develop the fishing industry to its fullest potential while safeguarding the resource base for sustainable development.

In January 2019, the Authority became a financially autonomous State-Owned Enterprise. Subsequently, a comprehensive review and modernisation of the Establishment Act was initiated to align the Authority with the Public Enterprise Monitoring Commission Act and to update its functions in line with evolving sectoral needs and governance standards.

The Seychelles Fisheries Authority Act, 2024 was officially assented to by the President of the Republic of Seychelles on 23 July 2024 and gazetted on 29 July 2024, marking a significant milestone in strengthening institutional governance and the sustainable management of Seychelles' fisheries sector.

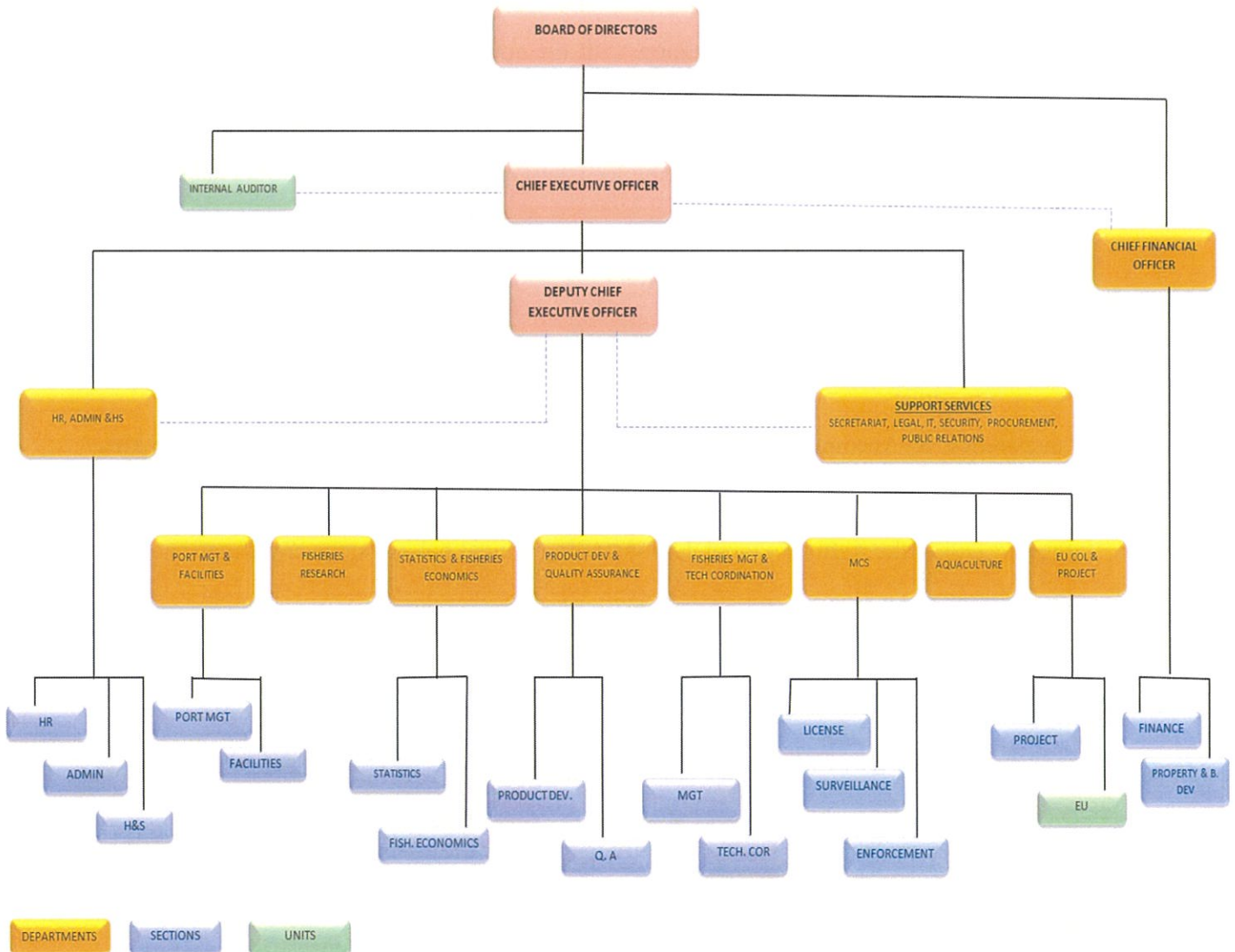

4.2. Functions

The Seychelles Fisheries Authority (SFA) is the leading agency dedicated to the sustainable management and development of the Seychelles' rich marine resources. For over four decades, SFA has been at the forefront of ensuring the responsible stewardship of our fisheries, balancing economic growth with the preservation of our marine ecosystems.

The functions of the SFA are to:

- (a) promote, develop and regulate fisheries;
- (b) advise the government on all matters related to fisheries;

- (c) assist in the formulation of national policies with respect to fisheries and lead the implementation of these policies;
- (d) assist in negotiations and represent Seychelles on matters related to fisheries;
- (e) promote and conduct scientific and development research related to fisheries;
- (f) enter into agreements in consultation with the authority responsible for ports, for the management or joint management of ports, harbors and related facilities;
- (g) administer the laws relating to fisheries and aquaculture and regulations made thereunder and other written laws relating to fisheries; and
- (h) advise the government on the manpower training requirements of Seychelles with regard to the fisheries sector.

A. Licences & Authorisations

Renewal of Certificate of Authorisation (COA)

A Certificate of Authorisation (COA) is a permit for fishing vessels that are larger than 24 meters in length overall or in case of vessels less than 24 meters, those operating in waters outside the Economic Exclusive Zone of the Flag State to fish for species managed by the IOTC in the IOTC area of competence. Boat Owners and Fishers Registration

Licenses are permits that a person shall obtain prior to engaging in a fishing activity or fishing related activity. Inquiries can be done via email: license@sfa.sc. C. Financial Assistance & Support Schemes

Special Loan Scheme for Artisanal Fishing

The special loan scheme aims to assist Artisanal fishing boat owners with funding to purchase, repair, or replace fishing equipment or undertake minor vessel repairs. To be eligible for the scheme the applicant's vessel must fall under the Artisanal fishery. Application can be done in person. Inquiry can be done via email: info@sfa.sc

Fisheries Schemes

-Fuel Incentive Scheme (FIS)

The FIS is a government-assisted excise tax concession on fuel, designed to reduce the operational costs of fishing activities.

-The Sickness Benefits Scheme

This scheme provides financial assistance to registered fishers who are unable to work due to

illness or injury

-Fisheries Insurance Scheme

A voluntary insurance scheme available for all full-time boat owners registered with SFA, providing coverage for vessels up to SCR2,000,000.

-Fishers' Pension Scheme

The Fishers' Pension Scheme is a joint initiative between SFA, the Seychelles Pension Fund (SPF), and the European Union (EU). The scheme provides retirement security for registered artisanal fishers aged 18–55 through voluntary contributions. Fishers contribute 5% of their salary (SCR 331.67 based on minimum wage), with the EU matching each contribution.

D. Sale of Fisheries Supplies

Sale of Ice

SFA has over 10 ice plants in Seychelles located mostly at fishing facilities, which provide ice at a subsidized rate to fishers. SFA gives priority to fishers and further supplies to the public subject to availability and at different rates.

Sale of Fuel

SFA provides fuel at a subsidized rate strictly to fishers.

E. Information Systems & Data Access

The Fisheries Information Management Systems (FIMS) developed by the Seychelles Fisheries Authority (SFA) is a comprehensive and centralized database and software platform. FIMS serves as the backbone of fisheries data management in Seychelles, capturing a wide range of critical information. FIMS enables efficient data collection, storage, analysis, and reporting, facilitating evidence-based decision-making and promoting transparency within the fisheries sector.
